

## ABOUT NABERS FOR PUBLIC HOSPITALS

NABERS Energy, Water and Waste for public hospitals rates the efficiency and environmental impact of entire hospital campuses.

NABERS is a national initiative managed by the NSW Government. Through a direct relationship with the Australasian Healthcare Infrastructure Alliance (AHIA), state and territory health departments, we have developed a NABERS for Hospitals rating tool. This rating tool will benchmark the environmental performance of

public hospitals, allowing for fair comparisons of different hospital sizes and locations.

Ratings are conducted by trained assessors within Health Departments, which are then certified and audited by NABERS.

NABERS works by providing a certified rating to a hospital which could be from one to six stars and it accounts for the operational usage of that hospital for a 12-month period.

## HOW WE DELIVER FAIR COMPARISON

NABERS ratings look at multiple inputs and adjusts for the differences between types of public hospital so it's always a fair comparison. In addition, as consumption figures can fluctuate, our algorithm uses an average over the year which accounts for seasonality.

Key hospital characteristics that make up the rating are the following:

- Type of health facility (peer group classification)
- Occupied bed days and commonwealth-funded aged care bed days
- Number of separations
- State and postcode (for climate corrections)
- Energy and water consumption data
- Waste data
